

Buried for 2,000 Years: A Chance Discovery Sparks Urgent Archaeological Race

One archaeological find led to an extraordinary excavation.

According to a report by Fox News, dog walkers in Lunan Bay in Scotland stumbled upon how shifting sands had uncovered footprints buried beneath it. Jenny Snedden and Ivor Campbell found these distinct markings,” which led to Campbell calling “...council archaeologist Bruce Mann who, suspecting both the significance of the discovery and the race against time they faced to capture it – called in expertise from the University of Aberdeen,” an official statement noted.
