Christian Denomination Plows Forward Into Apostasy

Christian leaders have condemned the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America after the denomination installed its first openly transgender bishop in a service at San Francisco's

Grace Cathedral this past week.

The Associated Press reported that Rev. Meghan Rohrer will lead one of the church's 65 synods and oversee nearly 200 congregations in Northern California and northern Nevada. The AP reported that Rohrer had identified as lesbian previously, "now reportedly identifies as non-binary and prefers to go by 'they/them' pronouns."

David Closson, director of the Center for Biblical Worldview at the Family Research Council, told Fox News that the ELCA's "embrace of transgenderism is completely at odds with scripture."

Exposed! Influential Democrat Facing Severe Consequences

A prominent cybersecurity lawyer on Friday pleaded not guilty to making a false statement to the FBI in a charge stemming from a probe of the U.S. government's investigation into Russian election interference.

Michael Sussman appeared Friday in D.C. federal court before Magistrate Judge Zia Faruqui. He is just the second person to be prosecuted by special counsel John Durham in two-and-a-half years of work.

Just the News reports Durham included in his indictment how Sussmann, a former attorney at the law firm Perkins Coie, allegedly used Clinton campaign funds to construct a now-debunked memo and other evidence alleging that computer communications between a server at the Alfa Bank in Russia and the Trump Tower in New York might be a secret backdoor communication system for Trump and Vladimir Putin to allegedly hijack the 2016 election. {eoa}

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
