Jack Hibbs Says Prayer Protected Americans and Carried Them Out of Afghanistan to Safety

Earlier this week, Pastor Jack Hibbs of Calvary Chapel Chino Hills in California says he “broke down bawling” when he received texts from friends on the ground in Afghanistan saying they were getting ready to leave the country.

During the recent withdrawal of U.S. troops, Afghanistan has been overrun by the Taliban, a radical Islamic terrorist group, and murder and chaos have ensued.

“People are safe and getting out, and that’s all because of prayer,” Hibbs told his congregation earlier this week. “We have friends who are on the ground in Afghanistan who were at the airport in Kabul. For the most part, the news has been horrific.

Standing at his kitchen window, 90-year-old Buddy McNabb had an ark-like experience as he and his three dogs watched the water around his mobile home continue to rise.

A sheriff in Waverly, Tennessee, said Sunday at least 22 people died in the record-setting rain that precipitated devastating floods in Humphreys County.

McNabb—initially believing he would be among those who passed away—credited his miraculous survival to God during an interview with The Weather Channel.

The Taliban has warned the U.S. that the deadline for safe exit is August 31st. If the evacuation goes past that date, the Taliban says there will be consequences. On top of that, we went from 2,500 U.S. troops keeping Afghanistan relatively calm, up to 6,800 U.S. troops just to secure an airport. So now the Taliban has given us a deadline of August 31st to get at least 6,800 troops out of Afghanistan. {eo}
