Magic Johnson Praises God for Divine Health Decades After HIV Diagnosis

This week, NBA legend Magic Johnson commemorated 30 years since his retirement from professional basketball following his diagnosis with HIV.

“God has really blessed me!” tweeted the 62-year-old former Los Angeles Lakers point guard. “Today marks 30 years living with HIV, so the message resonated with me in such a tremendous way. I thank the Lord for keeping me, giving me strength, and guiding me for 62 years but especially the last 30.”

At the point of Johnson’s retirement in 1991—an exit that came as a shock, leaving those gathered for his erstwhile press conference “motionless, stunned, numb”—he was one of the highest performing athletes in the NBA, with 11 All-Star declarations, three league MVP awards and five championship titles. {eoa}

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
