Why Anyone May Speak in Tongues Anytime

Speaking in tongues is a matter of the will, according to the apostle Paul. He said, "For if I pray in an unknown tongue, my spirit prays, but my understanding is unfruitful. What is it then? I will pray with the spirit, and I will pray with the understanding. I will sing with the spirit, and I will sing with the understanding" (1 Cor. 14:14-15, MEV).

He says that you will either choose to speak in tongues or choose not to. Everyone may do so anytime. Also, this passage proves that God does not speak through people when they speak in tongues and the Holy Spirit does not force people to speak.

Since speaking in tongues is a matter of one's will, it is therefore a faith operation. With Same-Sex Kiss, Disney's 'Lightyear' Film Underwhelms on Opening Weekend

"Lightyear," the latest film from Disney's Pixar, didn't make it to infinity and beyond this weekend.

The Disney flick, an animated biopic about Buzz Lightyear, the

astronaut from the *Toy Story* saga, fell well short of its projected box office earnings on opening weekend, according to Deadline. Disney anticipated a \$70 million weekend; instead, the movie brought in \$51 million domestically.

While the showing is lower than expected, it is certainly not a failure. It is on par with other Pixar movies like *Coco* (\$51 million) and *Ratatouille* (\$47 million). According to Variety, *Lightyear* cost \$200 million to produce, not including marketing efforts leading up to its theatrical release.
