

Demonic Possession? Mississippi Synagogue Arsonist Exhibits Paranormal Behavior

Was there a deeper, more evil spirit behind the Mississippi synagogue burning than we thought?

According to Fox News, the suspect of the Beth Israel Congregation in Jackson, Stephen Pittman, 19, was turned in by his father after he confessed to the incident.

However, something darker and quite sinister may have been going on in the background.

In the FBI affidavit, Pittman reportedly confessed to being the arsonist behind the act, calling the building the "synagogue of Satan." As Fox reported, Pittman's father alerted the FBI after seeing burn marks on his hands, face and ankles.



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The FBI stated that "Pittman laughed as he told his father what he did and said he finally got them." The suspect then made a virtual court appearance on Monday from the hospital where his hands were bandaged. When asked about his rights, Pittman said, "Jesus Christ is Lord."

Pittman also reportedly texted his dad an image of the synagogue before starting the fire, writing, "There's a furnace in the back." While his father pleaded with him to come home, Pittman said he was "due for a homerun" and "I did

my research.”

This bizarre and disturbing episode is not occurring in a vacuum.
