Professor Francesca Romana Stasolla from the Sapienza University of Rome spoke to the Times of Israel on the excavation process, stating that, "While we have not been able

to see the entire church excavated in one glance, new technologies are allowing us to reconstruct the bigger picture in our labs. If we were talking about a puzzle, we could say we are only excavating one piece at a time, but eventually, we will have a complete multimedia reconstruction of the full picture.”
