

Digital Doomsday? Anthropic Withholds AI Model Too Dangerous for Humanity

A new report from the Daily Mail discussed how Anthropic crafted an AI chatbot that has been deemed “too dangerous to release to the public.”

According to the Mail, Anthropic said that what they have made can hack infrastructure units such as power plants, electrical grids and hospitals.
