

Experts Warn State Bill Would Establish Permanent Muslim Privilege

A proposed Massachusetts bill is sparking controversy because it would create a permanent, taxpayer-funded commission to solely promote and support Muslims.

The controversial Massachusetts measure, Senate Bill and House Bill , is entitled, "An Act promoting the civil rights and inclusion of American Muslims in the commonwealth."

The proposed legislation aims to establish a state-funded commission focused on Muslim Americans. Its goals include promoting Muslim participation in public life "to combat Islamophobia."

The Boston Herald reports the bill would even form a commission "prioritizing qualified American Muslims in Massachusetts for jobs in state government over other residents of different religious backgrounds."
