Hobby Lobby's July Fourth advertising campaign includes a number of quotes and citations demonstrating how Almighty God and the Holy Bible have influenced our Founding Fathers, the Supreme Court, Congress and the education system.

- "IT IS THE DUTY OF ALL NATIONS TO ACKNOWLEDGE THE PROVIDENCE OF ALMIGHTY GOD, to obey His will, to be grateful for His benefits, and humbly to implore His protection and favor." —George Washington
- "And can the liberties of a nation be thought secure when we have removed their only firm basis, a conviction in the minds of the people that these liberties are of the gift of God? That they are not to be violated but

with His wrath? Indeed I tremble for my country when I reflect that God is just; that His justice cannot sleep forever.” –Thomas Jefferson

- “The Bible is the best of all books, for it is the word of God and teaches us the way to be happy in this world and in the next. Continue therefore to read it and to regulate your life by its precepts.” –John Jay: First Chief Justice
