"This weekend could be God giving my son a high five for what he did, for everything that happened," Simonson's father told .

In 2001, the then-8-year old entered the hospital to give part of himself to his sister, who had been diagnosed with a rare genetic condition called Fanconi Anemia.

To save her life, Simonson shared his "superstar NFL bone marrow," sister Shannon told .
