Blasphemous Jay-Z Film Taking Mockery of Jesus to a New Level

Rapper Jay-Z is no stranger to mocking Jesus and Christianity, and he's back to making fun of the Bible.

The Book of Clarence, set to release in January 2024, is a blasphemous Bible movie that some call faith-based. But with this film he has produced, Jay-Z is making it clear that it absolutely is not.

A film that distorts the Bible cannot be called faith based, a ministry called Vision unSEALED says. In an interview with Vanity Fair magazine, Jay-Z says that "faith is only a backdrop" for the movie. He says he is most concerned that those who hear about the film and it's premise might "immediately just focus on the religious aspect of it and not the human story."
