Carl Lentz Shares Details on Life After Ministry

Former Hillsong celebrity pastor Carl Lentz recently sat down with recording artist Lecrae to talk about his past and what life has been like after falling from ministry grace. Once a high-profile pastor with celebrity connections, Lentz is now speaking from a place of humility, acknowledging the pain he caused and the lessons learned.

Lentz's departure from Hillsong was a highly publicized event, shaking the global church community. His admission of infidelity led to widespread scrutiny, leaving many to question whether he could ever return to ministry. In the aftermath, he retreated from public life, focusing on his family and seeking restoration. He admitted to battling depression and deep shame, stating that his past actions deeply hurt his wife, children and congregation.

Lecrae points out that the huge ministry realm in itself breeds the possibility for pastors to be lifted up to a place of idolization, a spot that no human should be placed in. As Lentz points out, it led for him to also put himself in a position he did not belong.
