What Trump Did First on Inauguration Day Might Surprise You

In a powerful display of faith and leadership, Donald Trump began his Inauguration Day with a visit to St. John's Episcopal Church alongside his wife, Melania Trump, and Vice President-elect JD Vance and his wife, Usha Vance. Arriving at 8:43 a.m. EST after departing Blair House, the traditional residence for incoming presidents, Trump set a tone for the day that puts God first.
