

New Reality Show Wants to See if You're the Next T.D. Jakes or Creflo Dollar

The winner of the show will receive a lifetime opportunity preaching at two megachurches, \$25,000 and a new car.

The dropped trailer has stirred quite the controversy among viewers. A quick search on Facebook reveals many are taken aback by the show's premise.

"First they started (with) competition in worship, now it's competition in the pulpit? There is no competition in the kingdom of heaven! If you're concerned about becoming the 'next big thing,' check your heart! 'Whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God (1 Cor. 10:31),' " Nia Bullock writes on Facebook.

Jawn Murray writes: "No! No! NO! No more preachers on realityTV! #RealityTV #preachers #church."

However, others see the show as another way to advance the

kingdom.

"I love this... Go ahead Holy Spirit and get the Word of God out there by any means necessary! *Wow ... How strategic!*" Corletta J. Vaughn posted on Facebook.

So far, the television show has not been picked up by a network, nor does it have guaranteed judges, but the website promises "Christian celebrities" will pick the winner.
