

NYC's Mamdani Snubs Christians in Unprecedented Act

New York City's mayor, Zohran Mamdani, has snubbed Christians in the most unprecedented way possible.

prayer, and a renewed commitment to standing for biblical truth in a rapidly shifting cultural landscape.
