

Place of Wonders? Location of Jesus' First Miracle Revealed!

Did archaeologists just uncover the very spot where Jesus performed His first miracle of turning water into wine?

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According to the Daily Mail, archaeologists believe they just discovered the location of ancient Cana through excavation digs eight miles northwest of Nazareth in the village of Khirbet Qana.
