

Prayer Is Not Enough—White House Press Sec. Vows to Push Gun Control

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To the chagrin of Christians across the world, the Biden administration continues to distance itself from anything having to do with the Judeo-Christian values America was founded on.

In a statement released late Tuesday, White House Press Secretary Karine Jean-Pierre doubled down on the administration's plans for stricter gun control in the United States.

What stood out was her statement regarding prayer in the matter.

"Enough is enough. Gun violence in this country is an epidemic that will not end with thoughts and prayers alone."

As many within the administration move further left on the political spectrum, the Marxist views and policies they support bring with it the atheistic political approach that is incompatible with American values.
