

# Pro-Life Leaders Mourn Obamacare Passage

When the Supreme Court ruled in favor of President Obama's Affordable Care Act, it sparked many emotions in Christian souls. One of them is mourning.

"This is indeed a sad day for the people of this once great nation where liberty has always been equated with freedom of religion, freedom from oppression, and freedom of speech," says Judie Brown, president of American Life League.

"The good news is that none of the religious liberty suits related to the anti-life provisions of the Act were decided," Cody says, "so the hope remains that the draconian anti-life provisions of Obamacare will be ruled unconstitutional."
