

Ramadan at City Hall? Zohran Mamdani's Celebration Sparks Strong Reactions

New York City's new mayor, Zohran Mamdani, has sparked quite the outrage online after hosting an iftar at City Hall.

In videos circulating online, the Ramadan celebration can be seen with Muslim prayer mats overtaking the office as members eat and pray to Allah.

"When leftists say 'keep religion out of politics,' they only mean Christianity," Christian actor Kevin Sorbo wrote on X.

In his post on X regarding his hosting of Khalil, he stated, “For Mahmoud Khalil, this past year has been marked by profound hardship—and by profound courage.”
