

Trump and Netanyahu Stand at a Biblical Crossroads for Peace and Power

In a high-stakes phone call between two of the world's most scrutinized leaders, U.S. President Donald Trump urged Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu to end the war in Gaza and remove the immediate threat of military action against Iran.

Speaking from the White House on Monday, Trump confirmed the conversation with Netanyahu and shared his deeper motivation: "trying to avoid death and destruction." But he also made clear the reality of the challenge ahead: "They're just asking for things that you can't do. They don't want to give up what they have to give up... They seek enrichment. We can't have enrichment."

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Trump is right. Iran's regime remains a threat, and appeasement cannot be mistaken for peace. But with Netanyahu's strength and Trump's leadership, this moment may mark a divine opportunity for progress, not only in politics, but in prophetic alignment. Peace in Israel isn't just a headline; it's a heartbeat of biblical promise.
