

Trump's Prediction Raises Chilling Question After Tiger Woods Arrest: Prophetic or Coincidence?

The golf world was shaken Friday after news broke that Tiger Woods was involved in a rollover crash near his Florida home—an incident that now raises questions not only about his future in the sport, but the personal battles that can resurface even after seasons of recovery.

The Incident and Arrest

According to a report from WPTV, the crash occurred just before 2 p.m. on Jupiter Island, near 281 Beach Road. Video from the scene showed Woods' vehicle, a Range Rover, overturned on its side.

Authorities confirmed that Woods was arrested on suspicion of DUI following the accident. Martin County Sheriff John Budensiek told WPTV that it did not appear Woods was seriously injured. However, the situation quickly escalated into a legal matter. Woods reportedly complied with a breathalyzer test but refused a urine test. He was expected to be held for at least eight hours, in accordance with Florida law.



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Further details from Golf Channel revealed that Woods was described by officials as “visually impaired” at the scene. The report noted that he had struck another vehicle before the rollover occurred. Thankfully, neither Woods nor the other driver suffered injuries, and no additional passengers were

involved in either vehicle.
