

‘Two and Half Men’ Star Apologizes for ‘Filth’ Remarks

The teen actor in the CBS comedy *Two and Half Men* is now apologizing for calling the show “filth” and telling people not to watch.

The sitcom is known for its raunchy humor and sexually explicit dialog. Nineteen-year-old Angus T. Jones has played the character “Jake” since he was 10 years old.

In a video testimony with a Seventh-day Adventist radio broadcast, Jones said he had a spiritual awakening and that he no longer wanted to be on the show.

“Please stop watching *Two and a Half Men*. I’m on *Two and a Half Men* and I don’t want to be on it. Please stop watching it,” he says in the video. “Please stop filling your head with filth.

“You cannot be a true, God-fearing person and be on a television show like that. I know I can’t,” he says. “I’m not okay with what I’m learning, what the Bible says and being on that television show.”

But in a statement Tuesday, Jones said, “I apologize if my remarks reflect me showing indifference to and disrespect of my colleagues and a lack of appreciation of the extraordinary opportunity of which I have been blessed. I never intended that.”

Jones attends a Seventh-Day Adventist church in the San Fernando Valley, Calif.
