That's not a small claim. Cahn connects this ancient mystery to some of the most catastrophic and transformative events in modern history – the rise of Adolf Hitler and the Third Reich, World War I, the Holocaust, World War II, the spread of Marxism, the rise of the Soviet Union, and what he describes as forces still moving behind world events today.

A Story That Pulls You In – Then Wakes You Up

The book is structured as a globe-spanning thriller. A skeptic named Ariel Herzog receives a cryptic page from a secret book, launching him and an unlikely ally, Lara Winter, on a breathtaking journey across continents – New York, Istanbul, Berlin, Moscow, Havana, Jerusalem and beyond.

But Cahn is careful to draw a sharp distinction from other popular mystery thrillers. “It may sound like a thriller or a fantasy, something out of Indiana Jones or the Lord of the Rings or the Da Vinci Code,” he said, “but the Altar of Pergamon is different because the mystery it reveals is not fiction. It’s real.”

Where The Da Vinci Code was, in Cahn’s words, “totally anti-good and based on nothing,” this mystery is rooted in Scripture and documented history. It also ultimately leads to salvation.
