

Kathryn Krick's Biggest US Event Ever Sends Powerful Message: 'Revival Has Come'

"He can't bring revival when we mix around with the lukewarm and with the religion. New wine can't be in old wine skins. New wine can't be in old wine skins. Revival can't come through old wine we cannot be intimidated by the religious. I mean, I have this obligation to God. I can't be preoccupied with how people will think about will block revival if I do that because you can't mix new wine in the old wine skin. So God is coming sharply right now," she encouraged the audience before reminding them to be strong and courageous as we do the greater works that the Lord has called His people to do.

"Be strong. Be courageous. If you want to be used mightily by God, if you want to be after His heart, you have to make the decision yourself to be strong and be courageous. You have to make that decision that you don't care what anybody thinks. You only care what God thinks of you."

That expectation naturally transitioned into a powerful time of prayer and ministry.

As worship filled the arena, Krick invited the congregation to fix their eyes on Jesus—not on a preacher, a ministry or a personality—but on Christ Himself. Krick reminded attendees that throughout Scripture it was never human ability that parted the Red Sea, healed the sick or raised the dead. It was always God's power at work.

"Jesus does every miracle. It is not me. I am not a healer. I am not someone with special healing powers. I am simply a 's Jesus alone that does every miracle. And He gets all the glory

because I am just a vessel. There's nothing special about me," she said.

"Don't look to me," Krick repeatedly told the congregation. "Look to Jesus."

With that foundation established, she invited those battling anxiety, depression, trauma, addiction, sickness and oppression to place their faith not in a minister, but in the Miracle Worker Himself. From there, people across the room experienced deliverance, healing, renouncement from demonic spirits, prophetic impartation and the baptism of the Holy Spirit.

"I believe with all of my heart that God has done miracles for every one of you here. As long as you've had a mustard seed of faith, it's not too late."

God still does miracles. And He is working even right now.
