

USA.Life Social Network Opens Doors for Christianity

The first step to finish these sites is to reach the required funding goal. People can chip in any amount of the required \$778,000. Once the funding is provided, Andrew expects to launch the websites in 75 days. The **crowdfunding page** has already exceeded \$210,000.

“Freedom and privacy could be lost forever without ,” Andrew says. “However, we can launch the Christian Internet if 57,000

people give \$10, or if 5,700 supporters donate \$100, or if 570 people and churches give \$1,000. If you want Christian liberty, you need and 1776Free.”

New members are joining every day by signing up for a free account. Users get access to preferred usernames and project updates by joining now.
